Upcoming Events Remembering the Battle of the Atlantic

April meeting – HMCS Sackville and the Battle of the Atlantic, April 20, Shining Waters.

On September 1, 1939, Germany invaded Poland and WWII began. England and her Allies defended the freedom of millions of Europeans, but needed one million tons of food and military supplies delivered every week. April's presentation will follow the story of one of 122 Canadian-built warships that escorted convoys of merchant ships across the North Atlantic Ocean, facing German U-Boats. HMCS Sackville is Canada's Naval Memorial. Join Bert Walker, Outreach Coordinator for the Canadian Naval Memorial Trust, for this story of bravery, hardships and self-sacrifice.

Housing in the Bay: Anyone interested in housing for seniors in the Bay area will want to stay after the talk on HMCS Sackville. Developer Joe Arab will talk about his plans for new rental accommodation close to the Crossroads. Mr. Arab will show drawings of his proposed development.

The Bay Expo '17 planning team is busy with preparations and there are some ways you can help. The Expo will feature a silent auction, a flea market table and book sale.


We need high quality contributions for the silent auction and some treasurers for the flea market table. If you are donating books, please limit your contribution to 10 items.
